

# Health and Safety Standard No. 08

**Group** Development and Project Management

Title Competence (SKATE)

Date March 2018

### **Management & Supervision**

All Principal Contractor's and Contractor's management and supervisory staff employed on Landsec sites must have a demonstrable level of competence in terms of **S**kills, **K**nowledge, **A**ttitude **T**raining and **E**xperience (SKATE) in management / supervisory skills and Health & Safety.

The minimum standard for a Project Manager is Site Management Safety Training Scheme (SMSTS) and the relevant CSCS card to their occupation. For small works and trade supervisors the required standard is the Site Safety Supervisor Training Scheme (SSSTS) and the relevant CSCS card, to their occupation. All supervisors are required to wear black hats when working on site.

Standards of supervision levels on projects will be determined according to the level of risk involved in the specific operation and the competence (appropriate SKATE) of those undertaking the task, for example due to the high-risk nature of work at height activities, it must be supervised at all times. In addition, supervisors must be readily recognisable. (e.g. site supervisors must wear black hats to be instantly identifiable)

Contractors are required to declare and be able to demonstrate the level of Health & Safety training that has been completed by their managers and supervisors, relevant to their responsibilities.

## **Health & Wellbeing Training**

All Principal Contractor's and Contractor's must provide managers, supervisors and operatives with training in health and wellbeing. Examples of training include:

- NEBOSH Health and Wellbeing Certificate which is aimed at General Managers, supervisors, health and safety and HR personnel;
- BOHS Managing and Controlling Workplace Risks Certificate which is aimed at site managers and site supervisors
- Mental health first aid training which is aimed at anyone who is interested in learning the skills and confidence to spot signs of mental health issues
- Mates in Mind which is a training programme aimed to raise awareness, address the stigma of poor mental health and improve positive mental wellbeing in the UK construction industry

## **Operatives**

- All operatives on site must have a demonstrable skill level incorporating health & safety training. For example, a CSCS card at the appropriate level for the activities to be undertaken. "Right Card Right Job".
- This is in addition to any specialist or specific trade, task or safety training, which has been undertaken. For example, roof works
- These requirements must be monitored by the Principal Contractor for compliance throughout the project, with records maintained.
- If, at induction, operatives cannot provide the required proof of competency they must be refused permission to work on site.

#### **Non-English-Speaking Personnel**

Workers whose first language is not English must be able to demonstrate they have a basic understanding of both written and spoken English. If a worker cannot demonstrate this basic understanding, their employer must:

- Translate the induction, risk assessment, method statement and briefings including site emergency arrangements for them.
- Provide a mechanism to update operatives, n a language they are fluent I, on the daily significant hazards on site
- Any additional information is available in a readily understood format
- Assign an English-speaking worker who can translate and communicate to a group of workers (maximum of four in a group)

#### **Training**

Specific route of training / certification is required for the following:

- Crane & Lifting Appliance Operators, slinger / signallers, Lift Co-ordinators and Appointed Persons (CPCS)
- Forklift operators (CPCS, RITB, AITT)
- MEWP. operators (CPCS/IPAF) specific to the type of machine being operated and familiarisation training when working with MEWP's.
- MEWP's for managers for persons planning and putting persons to work on MEWPs
- PAL Plus advanced operator course should be considered for cherry picker work in a challenging and higher risk environment.
- Competency such as the IPAF PAV should be provided for Operatives using push along vertical platforms.
- Tower scaffold erection and use (PASMA) including advanced guardrail training.
- Working at height must have the appropriate level of training and be specific to the work activity.
- All scaffolders must hold appropriate certification, under the CITB Scaffolders Registration Schemes [CISRS] and comply with the latest Guidance Note's supplied by NASC or specific training by manufacturers on System Scaffolds.

Use of Specialist Sub-Contractors: Landsec require all our Principal Contractors to appoint competent contractors; a starting point for this is procuring contractors from the appropriate industry federation, for example:

- NFDC (National Federation of Demolition Contractors)
- NASC (National Access and Scaffolding Confederation)
- NFRC (National Federation of Roofing Contractors)
- NAS (National Association of Shopfitters).
- Other specialist contractors must be sourced from <u>Build UK</u>
- NSCC (National Specialist Contractors Council) e.g. NFRC (Roofing) FPS (Federation of Piling Specialists)
- MHFA (Mental Health First Aid England)

The following training and competence schemes are recognised by Landsec.

FASET	Fall Arrest Safety Equipment Training is required from all operatives who are involved in erecting safety nets on site.
IPAF	International Powered Access Federation for users of all forms of powered access equipment.
IRATA	Industrial Rope Access Trade Association training and certification in industrial rope access.
JIB card	Electrical, electronic, installation engineering and building services personnel

NCO(G)	Network Construction Operations (Gas) previously known as Gas Network Operations (GNO)
